The ISCRAM Board held its annual Face-to-face meeting in Brussels on March 1st and 2nd. One of the main objectives of the meeting was to take a strategic look at the organization, and to formulate specific goals as part of a future growth strategy over the next 10 years. The three specific strategic goals that came out of this discussion were as follows:

1. ISCRAM will have a fund for financing ISCRAM research
2. ISCRAM will have 500+ members
3. ISCRAM will have a top journal

Achieving each of these goals will be a great challenge for this and future Boards, and it will

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require hard work and commitment. However, the Board believes that it is the only way to keep the ISCRAM association growing as we move forward, both in quality and in quantity.

At this Face-to-face meeting, the Board also approved key processes that will impact our future conferences and publications. We have now better guidelines for track chairs and conference and program chairs, and a framework on how to initiate, conduct and quality control any future ISCRAM event large or small.

Another key achievement is the decision to move ahead with a proceedings publication and indexing agreement with Elsevier, to ensure that all of our conference proceedings can be more easily referenced and retrieved. The Board has worked hard to keep the ISCRAM proceedings open and free, despite a number of outside pressures. The agreement with Elsevier illustrates that our proceedings can be recognized for academic excellence, without compromising on our ideals.

Among its other activities this year, the Board has also approved a new discounted three-year ISCRAM membership option - not only does this provide a discounted membership rate, but also it keeps that rate the same for the three-year duration even if standard membership rates rise during that time. See more information on membership benefits at the end of this section.

To receive this discount, ISCRAM members in good standing may send an email to Linda Plotnick, the chair of the Membership committee, indicating that they would like the discount and agreeing to have their email address provided to the IDRC conference organizers for this purpose.

On the education front, the Board has approved Murray Turoff's request to form an Ad Hoc committee to create an education standard for a College Master's program in "Emergency Management Information Systems." The committee will be working hard over the course of this next year to explore this idea on behalf of the ISCRAM Association.

From an outreach standpoint, the Board has agreed to serve as an endorsing partner for the International Disaster and Risk Conference (IDRC 2014: <http://idrc.info/home/>). As a result of this new partnership, ISCRAM members are now being given the opportunity to pay a reduced conference registration fee at IDRC 2014.

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Two New Membership Benefits are Available

1. **Three-year Membership Discount:**

Workshops and Tutorials:

1. Tutorial – Delphi and Cross Impact Analysis for Generating Dynamic Emergency Scenarios
Sunday, May 18th: 8:30am-12:30pm

Explanation of the combined use of the Delphi Method, Cross Impact Analysis, and Interpretive Structural Modeling to create Dynamic Emergency Scenarios by soliciting subjective estimates from professionals; capable of being used for planning, foresight, and/or training. (Murray Turoff, Victor Banuls, and Linda Plotnick)
2. Workshop – Delphi and Cross Impact Analysis for Generating Dynamic Emergency Scenarios
Sunday, May 18th: 1:30pm-5:30pm

After explanations of two examples of the combined use of Delphi, Cross-Impact, and Interpretive Structural Modeling to produce dynamic scenarios for use in emergency management, participants will be shown how to set up and analyze an online survey instrument to collect the data; take the sample survey based on their inputs; and then break into small groups to generate examples of types of scenarios they would like to generate and preliminary ideas for doing so. 3. Tutorial – Visual Analytics with Social Media for Crisis Management
Sunday, May 18th: Full day, 8 hours

A hands-on tutorial that will explore freely available open source tools to extract, organise and visualise social media data for crisis management. Participants will be provided with coding material in advance and will be required to have appropriate software and API keys available before joining the tutorial. Limited to 20 participants. 4. Workshop – Educational Games for Crisis Response and Management
Sunday, May 18th: 1:30pm-5:30pm

This workshop will demonstrate how to convert educational objectives related to crisis response and management into educational video games, focusing on game development and instructional design. (David Thornton and Guillermo Francia III). Limited to 25 participants.

The ISCRAM Summer School is designed to bring together highly talented and motivated young researchers and experienced practitioners working in the areas of serious games, information systems, and disaster response.

The program of the ISCRAM Summer School consists of in-depth lectures, workshops, an augmented reality serious game, as well as a great social program. All lectures are taught by experienced experts in the areas of humanitarian information management, serious games, humanitarian action, disaster response, and information systems. The participants work in small groups and interact with mentoring lecturers throughout the Summer School.

OBJECTIVE AND TOPICS

The aim of ISCRAM-Med is to bring together researchers and practitioners working in the area of Information Systems for Crisis Response and Management and especially on Mediterranean crisis. Indeed, many crises have occurred in recent years around the Mediterranean Sea. For instance, we can mention political crisis such as Arabic Spring (Tunisia, Libya, Egypt, etc.), economic crisis in Spain and Greece, earthquake in Italy, fires in France and Spain, riots in French suburbs or even the explosion of chemical plant AZF in Toulouse. Some of them even had a domino effect on others.

Also, the shared history between the Mediterranean countries and common geopolitical issues led to solidarity among peoples and cross-country military interventions. This observation demonstrates the importance of considering some of these crises in this region at a Mediterranean level rather than as isolated phenomena.

CONTRIBUTIONS

All paper submissions must make a new and significant contribution to the body of knowledge on information systems for emergency management, support their contribution with valid arguments, and be clearly structured and well written. ISCRAM-Med 2014 invites two categories of papers:

- *Research papers* presenting valid, original, relevant cutting edge research that will be reviewed to the highest academic standards. Reviewing will pay additional attention to the application of the related scientific literature and theory, to the use of an appropriate research methodology, and to technical, mathematical and statistical correctness.
- *Demo papers* presenting new developments in emergency management and policy making, discussing approaches, methods, tools, (best) practices and standards. These papers should focus on practical issues and concerns and raise challenges for future research, and will be reviewed to the highest practice-oriented standards.

All papers (up to 12 pages LNCS style) should be written in English and submitted electronically in PDF format through the easychair conference system:

Every submitted paper will be evaluated by at least three members of the program committee. An ISBN number for the proceedings will be available and the papers will be indexed by DBLP.

These may include simulation studies, case-based research, empirical studies, and other applications of quantitative and qualitative methods, but also technological contributions with cross-disciplinary flavor (e.g. HCI, interoperability, etc).

Risk management has been related, in increasing degree, to Informatics and Cybernetics. Today, almost every organization depends on Information and Communications Technologies. Software and networks supporting organizational everyday activities must be

reliable, secure and safe. Flawed or failed software can present severe organizational and business risks that include liability costs, productivity loss, quality decreasing, brand damage, revenue loss, etc. Simultaneously, cybercrimes (cyber frauds, sensible data protection, etc.) and liability in the “electronic workplace” are requiring, with increasing urgency, an adequate risk management. Consequently, Organizational/business risk management is increasingly including informatics and cybernetics in their planning and activities. And vice versa, Informatics and Cybernetics technologies, concepts and theories are increasingly being used in risk management’s research, consulting, studies, projects, training, and activities.
